On Kashmir it is time to either put up or shut up



eptember 27, 2019 will go down in the annals of history of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf as a 'landmark' day because Prime Minister Imran Khan delivered a speech that virtually gave a new lease of life to the ruling party, which was under huge criticism from even the die-hard party workers, who believed the party had miserably failed in living up to its promises made during the election drive. There is no dearth of PTI critics who still believe that PM's speech, though was an excellent narration of Pakistan's point of view on the Kashmir issues, yet it was only a breather for a short span of time and PTI had to

deliver on its yows and promises if it really wanted to stay on for remaining period of its

There is no denying the fact that the speech went quite well both at home and abroad and Prime Minister Imran Khan lived up to the expectations as far as projection and highlighting the Kashmir issue at the international forum was concerned. That is why he was accorded a rousing welcome by the PTI workers and ministers when the he landed at Islamabad International Airport.

While Pakistan appears to have snatched world attention towards Kashmir issue thru this speech, the fact remains that the controversial decision of the Indian government still stands and miseries of Kashmiri people continue to multiply with the each passing day as curfew is still in place. This is not for the first time that a Pakistani leader delivered fiery speech at the UN. Former Prime Ministers Zulifigar Ali Bhutto and his daughter Benazir Bhutto had delivered more or less similar speeches. Even former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif did mention Kashmir whenever he chose to address the UN General Assembly. Intriguingly, despite all such tirades, we have not been able to draw serious world response to this issue.

Even response from the so-called Muslim ummah has been disappointing and lackluster. The OIC, whom I often call as a dead wood, too reacted quite late and therefore its reaction did not bother Indians at all, Turkey and Malaysia wholeheartedly supported Pakistan and assured full support for which Pakistan must be indebted to them.

Pakistani people have a very short memory. They will soon forget what PM Iram Khan said at the UN and in what fashion. After few days people will again start assessing govt performance according to its claims and election vows. Ostensibly, during last one year bad governance, plight of economy and wrong choice of people for various jobs have all taken a heavy toll on people for after passage of one year the government itself is not sure whether it is really in-charge of the affairs - what to talk of general public.

The main reason of govt's below the belt performance happens to be presence of too many power houses both at the Center and provincial level. Everybody who has some say in the party is calling the shots. Such elements have invested so heavily in the party that the party head even seems helpless in front of such power houses. With a disjointed party structure; poor governance and hostile Opposition, the government will head nowhere. Even on Kashmir, all speeches and actions can bear fruit provided all stakeholders including the Opposition parties are on the same page. The enemy hatches its conspiracies and executes nefarious designs after due diligence and proper homework. It exactly knows what our shortcomings are then exploits them to its benefit. Any dovish posture from our side would in fact encourage the enemy to ride on

Any breakthrough on Kashmir is possible only if our side resorts to some hard decisions such as escalation on the border and Line of Control (LoC). Mere speeches and rhetoric may not help force India to allow a plebiscite in the Occupied Kashmir. Enemi es would only take you seriously if they are dealt with in the language they understand. Therefore it is time that we should either put up or

Spain, Pakistan relations on a positive trajectory

Ambassador of Spain talks to CENTRELINE and DNA

How would you describe relations between Pakistan and Spain?

Our relations are cordial and friendly. Our two countries have a lot in common. The Muslim past of Spain (Al-Andalus) makes our country a very attractive tourist destination for Pakistanis and more and more Spaniards are coming to Pakistan to discover the beauty of its mountains and landscapes. Our two countries are willing to expand this good relationship by getting to know each other better. We are organizing a beautiful concert for April 2020 in which a Spanish flamenco group and Pakistani sufi performers will show everyone how beautifully both styles go together.

Actually, part of the flamenco tradition stems from Sindh and from the soulful and very spiritual chants that can still be heard in that region. The idea of melting together both styles proves that we have a lot of things in common and that we should explore more into our two cultures and find the many links that exist between them

Travelling and promoting cultural activities that bond our two nations are a both perfect ways of strengthening our already solid ties.

Also worth mentioning is the fact that our trade and economic relations are doing very well. The interest towards Pakistan as a potential market for Spanish companies is growing, and Pakistan is opening itself to our products and to possible investors by facilitating their presence here.

Can you share with us trade and economic volume between the two countries and how many Spanish companies are doing business in Pakistan and vice versa?

Roughly 1,3 billon USD per year. Pakistan exports more than one billion to Spain, mostly textiles, while Spain brings to Pakistan technology, tiles and olive oil. But there are several projects in the making. A Spanish company might start manufacturing helmets here in Pakistan. They would make the helmets

according to the Pakistani regulations regarding the kind of helmets required to drive a motorcycle. This would be a milestone for it would imply a direct investment in Pakistan. Other companies are also exploring this market.

I would also like to underline that a few companies are making business here already. More or less 40 of them.

How would you comment on the investment climate in Pakistan? Do you think the foreign investors including the Spanish ones have enough reasons to come to Pakistan?

A lot of progress has been made the last five years, but there is still room for improvement. I cannot hide the fact that our trade volume plays in favour of



Pakistan, therefore I would like to increase the level of our exports to Pakistan. That can be done, but for that to happen, Pakistan must ease the barriers that currently prevent many Spanish products from entering Pakistan ... mainly the labelling of the product in Urdu and the Halal requisite also on the labels Consumer goods from Spain would be appreciated by growing Pakistani middle classes and Spanish technology can foster the development of Pakistan. Railways could be an example of this. We are also ready to export items such as very high quality bathroom equipment made with a very groundbreaking design. Not only the materials such as porcelain are really competitive, but also the aluminum for the faucets and tubes. Kitchen equipment is also very competitive. Furniture with a modern design but a good price. And of course, technology that can be applied to different industries already operating in Pakistan

One way of improving trade and economic links is to establish contacts with the local business enterprise and chambers and you have already visited some chambers. Please tell us something more about such interactions and their utility with regard to promotion of trade and economic links?

Of course I have. They all have been really helpful and I, together with the Commercial attaché of the Embassy, have established links with many of them.

Chambers are really useful to guide possible future investors in Pakistan and also to organize trade fairs that our entrepreneurs can attend. They certainly promote trade and economic links between our two countries because they can illuminate us on what Pakistan can give and on what Pakistan expects from us.

markets through Spain. Is it possible?

The very idea of the EU is to establish a common market with common rules. Therefore the tariffs applied to Pakistani products in Spain will be equal to the ones applied by other EU member states.

Pakistan is already enjoying the GSP+ (GSP+: GSP means a partial or full removal of customs duties on two thirds of tariff lines and the + stands for the special incentive arrangement for sustainable development and good governance. It slashes these same tariffs to 0% for vulnerable low and lower-middle income countries that implement 27 international conventions related to human rights, labour

rights, protection of the environment and good governance)

Spain can very well encourage Pakistan to comply with the conditions under which the GPS + status was granted to Pakistan by the EU. As you know, this preferential status is offered to Pakistan in exchange for certain commitments assumed by Pakistan. Spain can only help Pakistan retain this status by reminding Pakistan of these commitments

Quite a large number of Pakistani Diaspora is now nestled in Spain. Can you share with us the figures and role of Pakistanis in Spanish development?

It is very difficult to provide a precise figure because many of the Pakistanis who arrived in Spain years ago have obtained the Spanish citizenship, therefore they are not registered as Pakistanis in Spain but as Spaniards. Nevertheless, the figure that we often give is 100.000. Most of them live in or near Catalonia, and they are really hard working people who definitely contribute to the welfare of our country with their efforts.

In past we used to hear some news about illegal immigrants from Pakistan to Spain but this trend seems to have been effectively addressed. Do you agree or still there are some cases?

Well, there are always cases of illegal immigrants arriving, not only to Spain, but to other EU countries. Once they arrive in a country which is part of the Schengen treaty, they can travel freely within the the Schengen space. But these are very isolated cases and we cannot talk about a trend or about a massive flux of Pakistani immigrants arriving into Schengen right now.

Tourism is yet another sphere where both countries can cooperate especially given the fact that Spain is a must-visit destination for tourists



from around the globe. How can we move ahead in this particular field?

I am very happy to announce that the visa upon arrival for Spanish businessmen travelling to Pakistan is already a reality. I have spoken with some businessmen who have come to Islamabad for several meetings and they have already benefitted from this new system. As soon as tourists begin to realise that they do not need to go the Pakistani Embassy to get a visa to visit Pakistan, I am sure that the number of Spanish tourists will increase.

Pakistan must launch tourism campaigns that should be shown in targeted countries. We have all seen in Spain wonderful initiatives from countries that were totally unknown to the potential Spanish tourists and the results are very positive.



Croatia, Malta , and other European countries that were not known by the Spanish traveler are now typical summer favorites... and that is all thanks to very well planned campaigns and also agreements with low budget airlines which were eager to expand their list of destinations. Pakistan must also develop its network of hotels and restaurants to offer a variety of high quality places to stay and eat. There is also room for improvement in the field of infrastructures... to attract tourism you must first prepare the country for the potential visitors. Spain can offer its experience and know how to help Pakistan in developing this promising industry

Regional situation these days is quite volatile because of developments in Kashmir and a non-agreement between US and Taliban on Afghanistan. How do seethesedevelopments?

I am optimistic because the different parties involved in both conflicts are talking as we speak. If there is dialogue, there is hope. I beleive that prosperity is a priority for all the countries in the region. And prosperity and war are incompatible. Therefore a solution will be finally found. There might be upheavals and a contained amount of discontent, but I do not really think these conflicts will escalate. Negotiations are underway, and that must makeus hopeful and patient.

EU earmarks 180 million euros for climate change relates project in Pakistan

EU envoy says Pakistan doing well in climate change, environmental issues; supports multilateral approach; Amin Aslam spells out govt priorities

ISLAMABAD, (DNA): Ambassador-designate of the European Union, Androulla Kaminara has said: "The EU remains committed to the Paris Agreement on climate change and its full implementation while progressing steadily with the finalization of the measures to reduce emissions by at least 40% by 2030.

She said climate change does not affect all countries in the same way and of course not all countries are responsible for climate change crisis.

"It has been proved that in already stressed societies climate change multiplies their woes. I have seen myself climate change affecting badly various countries".

She made these remarks while speaking on the occasion of Climate Change Diplomacy Day.

The event kicked off with the participants cycling from the Pakistan National Council of the Arts (PNCA) on a designated route as a symbolic gesture to raise awareness to curtail the growth of greenhouse emissions by promoting ecofriendly modes of transportation.

The event then moved on to a screening of documentary followed by a debate competition among students of various Islamabad schools. Student of Islamabad Model College for Girls Saleha Ahmed won the debate competition.

The EU ambassador further said the objective of this sustained engagement was for the EU to raise global climate ambition together with its partners, in particular those the most exposed to the negative side effects of climate change.

The ambassador said the EU always supports multilateral solutions as they are much more effective especially to deal with issues such as climate change.

Ms. Androulla Kaminara further said







Climate change requires collective action and the EU remains committed to continue working hand in hand with Pakistan, listed amongst the most vulnerable countries despite the low level of its global carbon emissions, she added. She said the EU also plans to undertake a project in Baluchistan in order to help government exploit all available resources.

Rab Nawaz of WWF-Pakistan, stressed the importance of promoting a common worldwide understanding of the need for action to mitigate climate change, "No matter how people perceive climate change, the phenomenon is real – we are experiencing an array of environmental

shifts, such as infrequent weather events, untimely glacial melt, glacial lake outbursts floods (GLOFs) and changes in animal and bird migration patterns, highlighting irrefutable linkages to climate change taking place in full effect."=DNA

"They have more acceptances in society than before. National Database And Registration Authority (NADRA) is issuing them Computerized National Identity Cards (CNICs) and various companies and departments are hiring them on the basis of their qualification and pure merit".

According to Mahnush's young chairperson, Maha Chishti, Mahnush aims to promote through the exhibition 'transequality awareness' and to bring forward the talent of its transgender team



members.

They (transgender vocational and skilled workers and artists) have worked very hard to produce home accessories, decorative items and other things, said Maha Chishti while referring to their things put on display.

Maha and her group of students earlier endeavoured some three years back to teach transgender community while she

was an A-level student.

However, they did not make headway as they (transgender) were scared at that time and feared their 'guru' would be offended.

Training them in vocational skill, however, was a bit easier, said Maha Chishti.

Mahnush took the initiative to inculcate

vocational skills within them so they are able to earn in a more dignified manner and respectable environment, said she.

Transgenders Sapna and Chandni while interacting with the media said they were grateful to Mahnush and its team lead Maha Chishti for helping them out and for encouraging them to get vocational training and now they felt quite relieved of their fears of being dismissed by the society.

Some of their handmade things included trays, posters, lamps and other accessories. Aleesha and Ayesha Mughal two transgenders, working in the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and Ministry of Human Rights (MOHR) respectively said they had come to express solidarity with their transgender friends and to make them realize they could change and better their lives by adopting a different attitude towards life.

In parallel, she always had a great interest in research and education and had served for two years as EU Fellow/Visiting Academic at St. Antony's College, Oxford University as well as research associate of King's college London. She specializes in EU policies and in geopolitics of energy.

Before joining the European Commission she had served as consultant for international firm, advisor to two Cabinet Ministers in Greece, Systems Analyst/project leader for a bank and general manager of a private consultancy firm.

It may be mentioned here that the EU and Pakistan are important political partners. The Delegation represents the EU on a range of issues including: development cooperation, trade, humanitarian assistance, security and counter terrorism, energy, environment, health, transport, migration and climate change.

Political and security relations are getting stronger, something which is underscored by the EU-Pakistan five-year Engagement Plan. A Pakistan-EU Joint Commission meets annually to review the plan's progress.=**DNA**

Meanwhile the Brazil food festival also kicked started on Wednesday which would continue for three days.=DNA

















Mohenjo-daro meaning 'Mound of the Dead Men' is an archaeological site in the province of Sindh, Pakistan. Built around 2500 BCE, it was one of the largest settlements of the ancient Indus Valley Civilization, and one of the world's earliest major cities, contemporaneous with the civilizations of ancient Egypt, Mesopotamia, Minoan Crete, and Norte Chico.

Mohenjo-daro was abandoned in the 19th century BCE as the Indus Valley Civilization declined, and the site was not rediscovered until the 1920s. Significant excavation has since been conducted at the site of the city, which was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1980. The site is currently threatened by erosion and improper restoration.


The city's original name is unknown. Based on his analysis of a Mohenjo-daro seal, Iravatham Mahadevan speculates that the city's ancient name could have been Kukkutarma ("the city [-rma] of the cockerel [kukkuta]". Cock-fighting may have had ritual and religious significance for the city, with domesticated chickens bred there for sacred purposes, rather than as a food source. Mohenjo-daro may also have been a point of diffusion for the eventual worldwide domestication of chickens.

Mohenjo-daro, the modern name for the site, has been variously interpreted as "Mound of the Dead Men" in Sindhi, and as "Mound of Mohan" (where Mohan is Krishna).

The English translation to the Mound of the Dead appears to be wrong on 2 counts. First, Daro/ Dero in Sindhi means Camp. The word for Mound is Teela. So it could be Camp of the Dead. But that does not make logical sense. Second, in Sindhi Mohen does not translate to dead. The closest is "marno" for dead in Sindhi. So it possible that the Englishmen distorted the spelling from marno to mohen. And since a mound and burial site was present they called it Mound of the Dead. The commonly seen reason that the Mohen in Mohenjo daro comes from Mohan (Lord Krishna) also does not look convincing. However the simple and rather obvious explanation for Mohen jo daro is that there is community/ tribe of fishermen/

boatmen called Mohena who have lived in that area for centuries. They are sometimes also referred to a Mir Bahar (Lord of the Sea) . So Mohen jo Daro or Camp of the Mohena makes complete logical sense.

Mohenjo-daro is located west of the Indus River in Larkana District, Sindh, Pakistan, in a central position between the Indus River and the Ghaggar-Hakra River.

It is situated on a Pleistocene ridge in the

middle of the flood plain of the Indus River Valley, around 28 kilometres (17 mi) from the town of Larkana. The ridge was prominent during the time of the Indus Valley Civilization, allowing the city to stand above the surrounding flood, but subsequent flooding has since buried most of the ridge in silt deposits. The Indus still flows east of the site, but the Ghaggar-Hakra riverbed on the western side is now dry.



Ms. Marchal, who is an EU "South Asian hand" having served several times in Delhi and Dhakka, while also covering the Maldives, Bhutan, Nepal and Sri Lanka, said the impetus had to be from within the region. Dr. Qamber mentioned that during 2018 and this year, IRS had held two international workshops on EU's core concerns: "Countering Human Trafficking in the Broader South Asian Region" and "Fake News in Our Region" in collaboration with the American Institute of Pakistan Studies and the American Consulate.

Other participants of the roundtable were Dr. Amr Elsayed Nasreldin Elsayed, First Secretary of the Egyptian Embassy, Prof. Safeer Awan, Dean Faculty of Language and Linguistics at NUML - with which IRS is collaborating in its Area Studies program including interns for outstanding students as well as senior IRS researchers.


