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














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









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# **New Uzbekistan-New Opportunities**

# Uzbekistan safest country to travel and invest

ASHKENT: Uzbekistan, ever since President Shaukat Shavkat Mirziyoyev has assumed charge of his office, is constantly on the move. The country is fast developing into hub of tourism activities. Besides, Uzbekistan leadership has sought to open up to the outer world with a view to inculcating deeper and stronger relations with various nations. Uzbekistan was once at the heart of the ancient Silk Road trade route connecting China with the Middle East and Rome. The country spent most of the past 200 years as part of the Russian Empire, and then of the Soviet Union, before emerging as an independent state when Soviet rule ended in 1991.

Under President Islam Karimov, who ruled from 1989 until his death in 2016, Uzbekistan was reliant on exports of cotton, gas and gold to maintain its economy. President Karimov's successor, Shavkat Mirziyoyev, has made efforts to follow legacy of Islam Karimov of building a prosperous and developed Uzbekistan. Islam Karimov,



Uzbeks say, laid the foundation stone of a modern and enlightened Uzbekistan and President Shavkat is carrying forward that agenda successfully.

This culturally rich and historically compelling country, along with the rest of central Asia, has been named the No. 1 travel region for the New Year due to its easy access and new visa-free travel ability. The Economist highlighted the country as well, naming it the most improved nation in 2019 due to significant government reforms that have accelerated over the past year. All of that, plus its untouched history and remarkable food, are making Uzbekistan an increasingly popular destination.

President Shavkat Mirziyoyev initiated ambitious reforms to transform the country into an attractive destination for travelers. Reforms include a 30-day period of visa-free travel privileges for visitors from 65 countries; and a simplified electronic visa system for citizens of 77 countries, including the United States, was just introduced, according to export.gov, which is managed by the US Commerce Department.



Uzbek cuisine can be characterized as flavorful and hearty with an array of rice dishes. Its most popular dish is the Uzbek pilau, the country's national dish which consists of a bed of rice slowly cooked with carrots, rice, onions and meat and dry fruits. Food bloggers are especially using this opportunity to experiment with the unique flavors and spices used in Uzbek cuisines.

There are big pilau centers in Tashkent









and elsewhere in the country offering mouthwatering dishes. The biggest Osh Pilau center is working in Tashkent for last 30 years. Because of its quality and delicious pilau it has become Central Asia's largest pilau center. However Pilau in Samrkand has its own taste. Served in a big clay pot, Samarkand Pilau is topped with vegetables, meat and garlic also. Uzbek Pilau is decorated with horse meat usually however guests who do not eat horse meat can ask the dish without it.

#### BULLET TRAIN

The Tashkent to Samarkand high-speed rail line is a 344-kilometre (214 mi) high-speed rail connection between Tashkent and Samarkand, the two largest Uzbek cities. The route passes through four provinces: Tashkent, Sirdaryo, Jizzakh and Samarqand in Uzbekistan. Trains operate seven days a week under the brand Afrosiyob. A 141 km long extension to Qarshi started operation on August 22, 2015, though at lower speed of 160 kph. An extension to Bukhara on the Talgo 250 ran for the first time on August 25, 2016 - marking the completion of a project to modernise the 256 km route from Samarkand. Travel from Tashkent to Bukhara, a distance 600 km, is covered in around 4 hours instead of 7 hours.

# BUKHARA POTENTIAL

Bukhara is one of the oldest cities of Uzbekistan with a thousand years of history. Bukhara is a holy city of Muslim world. There are many mosques, shrines, madrasahs, with the latest one among them dating back to the XIX century, preserved there.

The historic center of Bukhara has been listed by UNESCO as one of the World Heritage Sites. You will need at least two days to do Bukhara main architectural

Bukhara is a city-museum, with about 140 architectural monuments. The nation's fifth-largest city, it had a population of 247,644 as of 31 August 2016. People have inhabited the region around Bukhara for at least five millennia, and the city has existed for half that time. The mother tongue of the majority of people of Bukhara is Tajik.Located on the Silk Road, the city has long served as a center of trade, scholarship, culture, and religion. UNESCO has listed the historic center of Bukhara (which contains numerous mosques and madrasas) as a World Heritage Site.

Bukhara has been one of the main centres of world civilisation from its early days in 6th century BCE. From the







6th century CE, Turkic speakers gradually moved in.

Its architecture and archaeological sites form one of the pillars of Central Asian history and art. The region of Bukhara was a part of the Persian Empire for a long time. The origin of many of its current inhabitants goes back to the period of Aryan immigration into the region.

Char Minor (alternatively spelled Chor Minor, and also alternatively known as the Madrasah of Khalif Niyaz-kul) is a building tucked away in a lane northeast of the Lyabi Hauz complex.

The structure was built by Khalif Niyazkul, a wealthy Bukharan of Turkmen origin in the 19th century under the rule of the Janid dynasty.[22] The fourtowered structure is sometimes mistaken for a gate to the madras that once existed behind the structure; however, the Char-Minar is actually a complex of buildings with two functions, ritual and shelter.

Here recognition of role of Uzbek embassy in Islamabad spearheaded by Ambassador Furgat Sidikov also needs to be highlighted because it all has happened with their active support. During past few years both countries have come close to each other.

The ambassador and his staff took keen interest in taking bilateral relations to new heights. Opening of direct air link between Pakistan and Uzbekistan ostensibly contributed towards further deepening of this relationship.

# Uzbek citizens in Pakistan cast their votes



SLAMABAD, (DNA) Uzbek nationals living in Pakistan cast their votes in parliamentary and local govt elections at polling stations established at the Embassy of Uzbekistan in Islamabad.

Ambassador of Uzbekistan Furqat Sidikov and other embassy staff also cast their votes.

The polling started from 8 a.m and voting process began with the participation of citizens of Uzbek republic permanently residing in Pakistan.

In the 22nd polling station, created at the Embassy, active participation of citizens of Uzbekistan in exercise of their constitutional rights has been shown.

In particular, citizens showed great interest in the voting process itself and the programs of 5 candidates from 5 political parties of Uzbekistan.

As a sign of the exercise of their constitutional

rights, the citizens of Uzbekistan were provided with symbolic badges specially prepared by the Embassy with the inscription "New Uzbekistan - new elections". This badge was handed over to each voting participant, as well as to members of their family. Especially for citizens of Uzbekistan, the embassy organized a festive pilaf, including other dishes of national cuisine (samsa, manti, shurpa, sweets). The Uzbek citizens appreciated the arrangements made by the Embassy for them.

They said they felt indebted to the Embassy staff and officials for proving them with an opportunity of exercising their fundamental right of voting.

ashkent, Uzbekistan (DNA) – A lot has changed in Uzbekistan. This assessment was given by the transformations in Uzbekistan by the head of the OSCE / ODIHR Mission, Cayetana De Zulueta Owtram, during a visit to the 882th polling station in Tashkent on 22 December. Tana de Zulueta noted that the OSCE / ODIHR Mission, which arrived in Uzbekistan on 25 November, works throughout the country and works closely with the Central Election Commission.

"We were granted full access and all the conditions for our work were created. For the first time in Uzbekistan, over 300 observers from both the ODIHR and the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly, representing 37 countries participating in the Organization, observe the elections. In previous years, there were limits, but now this is not. This is good for the country and allows Uzbekistan to gain even more experience in ensuring transparency of elections," the head of the OSCE / ODIHR Mission said.

Zulueta said that since 2015, when she headed the OSCE observer mission in the presidential election, a lot has changed in Uzbekistan. The Electoral Code was adopted. Today, OSCE observers monitor how code norms work in practice.

She noted that in general, the elections in each country are different from each other, but the principle of elections is the same – citizens choose candidates.

The Head of the OSCE / ODIHR Mission emphasized that the Organization's observers do not interfere in the election process, they only observe the voting and, if they see any violations of the law, they are included in the final report. At the same time, she informed that preliminary results of the observation will be presented at a press conference, which is

scheduled for 23 December with the participation of the OSCE PA President G. Tsereteli.

"I also want to note that we will be present in Uzbekistan until 29 December. We will monitor the course of events after the election and monitor the moments that may affect something. Our final report will be published next year," T. de Zulueta added.

Moreover, T. de Zulueta with great satisfaction told the media that she was honored to meet with President S. Mirziyoyev and personally see how important the election of the country's parliament is for him and the people of Uzbekistan.

It should be noted that on 13 December an interim report from the OSCE / ODIHR Mission was published covering the period from 25 November to 10 December. It recognizes marked progress in improving the electoral law and electoral practice, states the efforts of the government to modernize the public and public administration system. On the whole, a positive assessment was given to the preparations for this important political event.

We remind you that during the 2019 parliamentary elections in Uzbekistan, the OSCE is represented for the first time by all key structures — the full-fledged ODIHR Mission, the Parliamentary Assembly and the ODIHR leadership represented by its director I. Gisladotir.

The decision to send two full-fledged missions (ODIHR and PA) to observe parliamentary elections by experts is seen as evidence of the OSCE's recognition of the democratic reforms implemented in Uzbekistan, as well as the high interest of the international community in the electoral process as an important event in further strengthening the role and increasing the seat of parliament in managing the affairs of society and the state.

# Uzbekistan's Parliamentary Elections 2019 - from the Eyes of an International Observer

Recently, Parliamenta ry elections were held in Uzbekistan

December 22.These elections provided an opportunity

to Uzbekistan to propel the nation forward on the path of democratic transition and initiate the realization of the nation's great potential. A total of 825 observers, as well as representatives of nine international organizations comprising 41 countries including Pakistan, andChina, observed the electoral process in all regions of the country.

All the International experts praised the renewal process in Uzbekistan, recognized the comprehensive nature of the implemented "Action Strategy", which covers all the spheres of state and the society. It was noted that Uzbekistan showed a strong political will by starting a new stage of decisive and deep reforms and transformations.

Being an international observer, I have analyzed the current results of reforms in improving administrative management, which have focused on the interests of people. Particular attention was paid to the measures for strengthening the rule of law in the activities of law enforcement agencies, which in their work give priority to democratic progress and enlightenment.

I visited 20 different polling stations in the vicinity of Tashkent and found the staff to be highly professional, highly energetic and hospitable towards the voters, as they also arranged food for the citizens who came to cast their vote.

Five political parties contested in

these parliamentary elections of Uzbekistan in which each participating political party covered a wider spectrum of manifesto including social justice, rule of the law, women empowerment, job creation, anti-corruption, economic prosperity, stability and sustainability, agricultural revolution and further politicization and democratization. Each party freely run its election campaign before the polls andtried to attract the voters especially youth in the democratic battle of political supremacy through the dominance of

Mirza-Ulugbek Abdusalomov, Chairman of the Central Election Commission of Uzbekistan (UCEC) had announced the Electoral Code for the parliamentary elections 2019. UCEC entirely and equally supported every contesting political party to run its electoral campaign by ensuring the elements for free, fair and transparent polls, considering it as the significant pillar for the strategic transformation of Uzbek nation.

Although, the various political groups had diverse political targets at the same time all shared one aspect of true patriotism.Uzbekistan has proved that it is truly a democratic country despite having its own unique and functional democratic system for centuries which is still relevant to the

people's desire.

In Uzbekistan suffrage is universal for individuals 18 years of age and older. All aspects of elections, particularly registration by parties and candidates, are controlled by the government's Central Election Commission. An election is legally valid if more than 50 percent of eligible voters participate and a candidate receives more than 50 percent of the votes. The Republic of Uzbekistan is a democratic country where ballots dominate overconcentration of power. It is the only country in the world which has its own "Magna Carta" (the Great Charter of the Liberties) and "Social Contract" from centuries because it has very rich civilization, culture, heritage and traditions which are all based on rule of the law i.e. democracy.

In my opinion, these were the elections, which had never happened in the history of Uzbekistan in terms of quality, general organizational preparation for the process and attitude of the media. I think this is a big step for Uzbekistan.

In fact, this atmosphere will further create the prospects of development. These elections have created a space for openness, transparency, and healthy criticism for the betterment of the country's democratic structure. Of course, there are still many elections ahead, but



these elections will leave their mark on history as the elections that formed a constructive dialogue between people and the political parties. The elections were held in an open and transparent atmosphere. In addition, these elections were in the spotlight. Citizens expressed their views on elections and parties. This means that the citizens have a growing sense of involvement in this electoral process.

More than 71% of voters have participated and cast their votes in the elections which is a strong step towards the democratic transition and transformation of Uzbekistan. The active participation of observers, the coverage of mass media, the positive remarks by the international community have further strengthened the reformed process of Uzbekistan's elections. Another significant aspect of these elections is that there is an increase in the socio-political activity of Uzbek people and an increase in legal awareness. The polling staff was highly trained and they knew all the procedures regarding the polls. The polling staff actively guided the citizens regarding the procedure of balloting.

The elections were also held under the new financing system, in accordance with the Electoral Code.The observation mission from a joint undertaking of the OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) also concluded that the recent changes to election legislation have brought Uzbekistanmore closer to the international standards to which all OSCE countries have committed. Electoral preparations were efficient and accompanied by an intensive voter information campaign. Election Day was calm as the introduction of a Unified Electronic centralized "VoterList" and its implementation in practice is a significant step forward. The parliament has been given additional competences in recent years that could potentially make a significant change to the balance of governmental power as in Uzbekistan for the first time, more than 20.5 million voters registered.

While these elections were clearly more open than in the past as recent reforms have created more space for citizens to air their grievances publicly, as tolerance of criticism of



the state administration has grown. The degree of freedom of expression in the media has also improved, and some people now feel able to post views online through blogs and social networks. Independent voices are growing in number and strength, and there is a new sense of freedom.

Moreover, democracy functions in all its true spirits in the Republic of Uzbekistan. Democracy stands for the rights of people which are fully enacted throughout the country. Democracy is "for the people, by the people and of the people" which has already been institutionalized so many years ago in Uzbekistan.

The government of Uzbekistan has



been rigorously working on the motto of H.E. President Shavkat Mirziyoyev "New Uzbekistan, new elections" which shows his untiring efforts to establish a vibrant society, articulated political system and a befitting economic system based on "good governance" for achieving desired goals of socio-economic prosperity in the country.

President Shavkat Mirziyoyev has pursued a diversified but integrated national policy to transform Uzbekistan's decision-making processes, invigorate civil society, encourage healthy and productive political competition, address human rights and develop a civic culture consistent with the country's status as a modernizing, forward-looking regional power in Eurasia with a steadily increasing majority of citizens under the age of 30.

The idea of Ziyarat tourism relations development between our countries was warmly welcomed by the President and Prime Ministry of Pakistan. As you know, investment is the driver of economy. New technologies, advanced experience and highly qualified specialists come with investments into all sectors of Uzbekistan, business is rapidly developing.

In order to create the most favorable conditions for attracting foreign investments, in Uzbekistan have been created more than 20 free economic zones.

Free economic zones participants are exempted from payment of land tax, profit tax, property tax, customs payments for equipments, raw materials and components, imported for their own production needs.

We are offering to Pakistani companies to realize joint investment projects in Uzbekistan in the fields of textile, leather, agriculture, chemical, construction and other areas.

# OSCE/ODIHR Mission Statement On Elections in Uzbekistan

n December 23, 2019, the Mission of the Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE / ODIHR) published on the official website the Statement of preliminary findings and conclusions from the monitoring results of parliamentary elections in Uzbekistan from November 25 to December 23 this year. It is noted in the statement that the elections were conducted in the context of comprehensive reforms, initiated by President Shavkat Mirziyoyev in 2017. The reform strategy, which is being implemented in stages, aims to transform Uzbekistan's economic, social and political life. It is underlined that the elections, held under the slogan "New Uzbekistan - New Elections", has termed an irreversible modernisation and democratisation process. The transformation of economic, social and political life is, by definition of the head of Uzbekistan, irreversible.

OSCE recognizes that the recently adopted Election Code incorporates several previous OSCE/ODIHR recommendations and brings the legal framework closer in line with OSCE commitments and other international obligations and standards.

Positive assessment is given to a great effort of the Central Election Commission (CEC) to prepare the parliamentary elections in an improved manner. Ascertained abidance of the CEC the procedure for conducting elections. It is noted improving access for persons with disabilities, training thousands of polling officials and conducting an intensive voter information campaign. It is welcomed the granting the right to vote citizens sentenced to a term of imprisonment for less serious crimes.

The introduction of the new centralized voter register, the Single Electronic Voter List (SEVL), is evaluated as a significant achievement, which was designed to both lessen the possibility for multiple entries for the same person and to better ensure the universality of the vote.

For the first time since 1999, the ODIHR report notes the openness and transparency of elections. The election campaign was held under conditions characterized by the highest respect and authority. The media widely covered the election. Moreover, the OSCE praises what is evidence that civil and political circles openly come forward with political proposals and criticism of the authorities. The campaign took place in an environment characterized by increased

assertion of and tolerance by the authorities for freedom of expression, though legal restrictions on this and other fundamental freedoms persisted.

An important novelty, as noted in the statement, is that frequent live debates took place, most of which was broadcast live. The media had more opportunities to cover the elections. Bloggers are seen as the most important source of independent commentary, and their influence is increasing. It is noted that OSCE observers did not record any discriminatory practice or commentary on minorities during the campaign.

For the first time, it is also recognized that the Election Code establishes a reasonable framework that provides legal means of responding to violations of electoral law and the obligation of parties to publish reports on the spending of funds in the election campaign on their website and in the media within a month. It is emphasized that in total, the CEC accredited 820 international observers and 135 international journalists for whom was created equal and unhindered access to the electoral process.

OSCE document also lists a number of other positive transformations in state and public administration system, electoral practice.

# Uzbekistan expects more tourists from Pakistan: Davrukov Fakhriddin

ISLAMBAD, (DNA) Davrukov Fakhriddin, Deputy Chairman of the State Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan for Tourism Development has said Uzbekistan accords great importance to its relations with Pakistan adding being one of the largest countries in the region, we expected big flow of tourists from Pakistan.

He said Uzbekistan has seen huge influx of tourists from across the globe during past few years mainly because of excellent facilities provided to the tourists and liberalization of visa regime.

The Deputy Chairman expressed these views in an exclusive interview with DNA news agency, CENTRELINE magazine and daily

Shukhrat Isakulov Head of Statistics department and Feruz Dodiev Deputy Head of International Affairs and Protocol Department were also present on the occasion.

The Uzbek tourism committee acts as a tourism ministry and its Chairman and Deputy Chairman's status is equal to minister and deputy minister respectively. Both of them are appointed by the President of Uzbekistan.

The deputy chairman said huge tourism potential exists between Uzbekistan and Pakistan but unfortunately we have not vet explored this potential fully. He nevertheless hoped that the recently

launched direct flight between Pakistan and Uzbekistan will surely increase flow of Pakistani tourists to Uzbekistan.

While talking about religious tourism he said his country was consistently implementing comprehensive measures to develop the tourism industry as one of the strategic sectors of the national economy, which ensures the accelerated development of the regions, increasing the income and quality of life of the population, as well as improving the investment attractiveness.

Mr. Fakhriddin added, both Uzbekistan and Pakistan being the Muslim countries possess plenty of religious sites therefore both have every reason to expand and intensify their cooperation in religious tourism.

He said Uzbekistan had got international recognition as one of the largest centers of Ziyarah tourism in the Islamic World. In Uzbekistan there are more than 7,000 priceless memorial monuments of historical material heritage – the main centers and destinations for the tourism in Uzbekistan. A huge role is played by rich national traditions and values, emanating from the pre-Islamic period of civilization, thanks to which such priceless material objects were created.

He said President Shavkat Mirziyoyev initiated ambitious reforms to transform the country into an attractive destination for travelers. Reforms include a 30-day period of visa-free travel privileges for visitors from 65 countries; and a simplified electronic visa system for citizens of 77 countries, including the United States, was just introduced, according to export.gov, which is managed by the US Commerce Department.

'In 2017 we had more than 2.6 million tourists while in 2018 the number rose to 5.4 million visitors which means we almost doubled the tourism flow. It was due to visa liberalizations and other measures. The E-visa system is very comprehensive and easy to follow. The electronic visas are granted in just two days'.

The Deputy Chairman (Deputy

Minster), further said ever since opening the doors for tourists they had got huge response even beyond their expectations. They were actually not ready for such a huge response therefore they had to work on war footing to improve and expand infrastructure to accommodate more and more tourists.

He said Uzbekistan offers huge incentives to those investing in the hospitality industry. People investing in hotel industry are offered cash back facility. While further elaborating this facility the deputy chairman said for instance somebody building a hotel of 50 or more than 50 rooms is compensated @ USD 4.5 thousand per room. The compensation is paid immediately after the completion of the project. He however made it clear that this

facility is available only for next three years.

To a question about security of the tourist Davrukov Fakhriddin said Uzbekistan is a safe country and due attention is paid towards flawless security of the visitors.

He said we did something unique in Uzbekistan by establishing tourism police and appointed a separate deputy tourism minister who is in charge with the security and development of the tourism sector.

"The tourism police comprise very well educated men and women who are quite familiar with the touristic practices. They are efficient, responsible and cordial. Just recently a family lost its valuables in Samrkand. The family reported it to tourist police and within no time the family got its belongings back". DNA





# Investment Climate In The Republic Of Uzbekistan:Current State, **Challenges And Solutions**

s you know, a favorable investment climate is a prerequisite for ensuring a stable high development of the economy, attracting investments in regions and industries, and enhancing entrepreneurial activity. It contributes to the influx of foreign direct investment in important industrial and social projects, expands the possibilities for innovation, and improves the quality of socio-economic development.

Over the years of independence, Uzbekistan has gone through a difficult stage of restructuring the entire economy, accompanied by certain difficulties in terms of developing a suitable concept and mechanisms for its

implementation.

In particular, it must be admitted that for a long time certain issues remained unresolved in the field of doing business (including currency conversion, free repatriation of profits, attracting international financial institutions, etc.), and this, in turn, seriously affected the investment attractiveness of the country.

In the first half of 2019, the volume of utilized foreign investments grew by 4.3 times compared to the same period in 2018 and amounted to \$ 5.6 billion.

By the end of 2019, the development of foreign direct investment in the amount of at least \$ 7 billion is expected. For comparison, this figure in 2018 amounted to \$ 2.8 billion.

In addition, over two years, the number of enterprises with foreign investment doubled - the figure is more than 10 thousand. The share of investments in the GDP of Uzbekistan for the first time amounted to 38%.

According to the results of January-March 2019, Uzbekistan conducted trade relations with more than 150 countries of the world. Over the past year, total turnover increased by 37%. The main trading partners of the Republic are countries such as China, Russia, Kazakhstan, Korea and Turkey. As a result, Uzbekistan was ranked 69th among 190 countries in the Doing Business 2020 ranking and entered the top 20 reformer countries in terms of creating the most favorable conditions for doing business. For comparison, we note that in 2012, the country in this rating occupied only 166 place. Uzbekistan has also resumed active negotiations on accession to the World Trade Organization (WTO). Joining the WTO will provide an opportunity, for Uzbek entrepreneurs, to raise the prospects for increasing scientific and technological progress in the sectors through the acquisition and purchase of efficient and reliable imported equipment. In addition, upon entry into

the WTO, domestic exporters will gain easier access to foreign markets.

Uzbekistan's potential is based on solid macroeconomic fundamentals - it is a country with a strong domestic market, relatively young and cheap labor, rich natural resources, a relatively diversified economy and a rapidly developing infrastructure.

In general, Uzbekistan has the advantage of macroeconomic stability, which, combined with ongoing reforms, opens up opportunities in various sectors of the economy, be it financial

services, construction or tourism.

NECESSARY INSTITUTIONS CREATED FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND PROTECTION OF

ENTREPRENEURSHIP

To effectively ensure the rights and legitimate interests of business entities in the country, appropriate structures have been created, whose task, among other things, is to consolidate efforts in the field of entrepreneurship development.

In particular:

The Ministry of Investments and Foreign Trade is the state body of the Republic of Uzbekistan, dealing with export issues, attracting foreign investment and other aspects of the economy and international trade

- Receptions of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Uzbekistan for consideration of appeals of entrepreneurs - ensure the quality and efficiency of the organization of work

with appeals of entrepreneurs;

- Foreign Investment Promotion Agency under the Ministry of Investments and Foreign Trade participation in the implementation of the state investment policy to attract foreign investors and creating favorable conditions for the work of foreign businessmen who want to invest in Uzbekistan.

- The Commissioner under the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan for the protection of the rights and legitimate interests of business entities provides guarantees for the protection of the rights and legitimate interests of business entities;

- Agency for the Development of Small Business and Entrepreneurship implements a unified state policy aimed at the development of

entrepreneurship.

- The Council of Foreign Investors under the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan - the main task of the Council of Foreign Investors is to directly participate in creating a favorable investment climate and effective mechanisms to stimulate domestic and foreign entrepreneurs to

invest in priority sectors of the economy, as well as to the regions of the country, with the aim of organizing high-tech industries to produce competitive export oriented products.

In turn, the Ministry of Justice is also carrying out consistent work in this direction.

In particular, according to the results of the analysis of law enforcement practice, relevant proposals are developed to eliminate systemic problems that hamper the development of entrepreneurship, as well as aimed at improving the business environment as a whole.

For example, it is expected to introduce a system for assessing the level of entrepreneurship development in the regions of the Republic, which will allow timely identification and elimination of problems that impede the development of entrepreneurship and attracting local investments.

Work is underway to radically improve the licensing system and licensing procedures (proposals will be made to eliminate bureaucratic barriers in obtaining licenses and permits, reduce the number of licenses and permits, and also reduce the time for issuing them).

## CHALLENGES IN THE WAY OF EFFECTIVELY ATTRACTING INVESTMENTS AND THEIR SOLUTION

Along with the achieved results, there are also areas requiring appropriate adjustments.

As you know, in advanced foreign countries (USA, England, etc.), the bulk of the financing of the economy comes from equity funds, bonds, and only the smaller one consists of a form of bank

In Uzbekistan, banking sector assets are 130 times higher than the shares of free float.

In particular, today the volume of securities in free circulation is only 0.5% of the country's GDP, the market capitalization of securities at the end of 2017 amounted to 5.9% of GDP.

These are very modest figures, which, on the other hand, show huge potential

for growth.

Based on this, in order to develop this direction, in early 2019, the Agency for the Development of the Capital Market was created.

No less important is the course taken to reduce state participation in the economy and the privatization of state assets. In 2020, the Management and Privatization Strategy of state-owned enterprises will be adopted, which provides for the criteria for maintaining state ownership of enterprises and their transformation into efficient enterprises that can compete in the domestic and foreign markets. By 2023. Uzbekistan plans to privatize at least 20 large state-owned companies.

At the same time, one of the main conditions for attracting investments is the provision of guarantees of property

However, recently there have been some problematic issues related to ensuring guarantees of property rights. In particular, cases of violation of the rights of owners during the seizure and demolition of real estate.

In recent years, the country has been actively working to improve the architectural appearance of cities,

improve the living conditions of the population and implement investment projects. These works in some cases were accompanied by the seizure and demolition of real estate, often dilapidated, in disrepair, and also not meeting the requirements of urban planning.

Unfortunately, this process was not always carried out by local authorities in accordance with the requirements of the law, which required the adoption of urgent measures to unconditionally ensure the rights of owners.

Along with this, until recently, there were still bureaucratic barriers and red tape in the allocation of land.

In addition, there were cases of initiation of issues of revision and cancellation of the results of privatization, which negatively affected the confidence of entrepreneurs in ensuring ownership.

The course taken on the policy of openness, direct dialogue with the public, including with entrepreneurs and investors, made it possible to timely identify problematic issues, as well as take effective measures to address them.

In particular, in order to address the above issues, appropriate decisions were taken by the President and the Government of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

Thus, in recent years, intensive reforms have been carried out under the leadership of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan Sh. Mirziyoyev, including those aimed at ensuring a favorable investment climate.

At the same time, meetings held with entrepreneurs and investors showed a lack of awareness of the local civil servants on the nature and content of the reforms.

It should be noted that the effectiveness of reforms is determined not by the number of legislative acts adopted, but by the full provision for their implementation.

Based on this, in early November 2019, the legal monitoring system was introduced, aimed at ensuring 100 percent and uniform implementation of legislative acts.

Thus, despite the positive results achieved, it seems necessary to continue focused work to improve the investment climate in the country.

First of all, such issues as ensuring reliable protection of the rights and legitimate interests of entrepreneurs, including foreign investors, further strengthening the protection of private property, stimulating the development of competition in the investment market, developing the capital market, improving law enforcement practice, etc. need to be further developed.

The solution of these issues will undoubtedly open up new opportunities for the wide promotion of the investment potential and the republic's opportunities abroad, as well as positively affect the positions of the Republic of Uzbekistan in such international ratings as the Index of Economic Freedom, the Rule of Law Index, the Corruption Perception Index, where our results so far remain modest. visitors can see how the pilaf is made. There is huge Owens in which pilaf for thousands of people can be cooked. This restaurant had two big Owens and two medium sized Owens which means it can cater to needs of more than four thousand customers on daily basis. The restaurant located in the heart of the Capital, operates from 8 am till 10 pm.

Pilaf is prepared with rice and includes raisons; chick peas and meat. Uzbek Pilaf is usually made with beef, however Pilaf with lamb and horse meat is also equally popular. Pakistanis do not eat horse meat therefore we had to ask them to bring Pilaf without horse meat. If you do not tell them, then the dish is normally topped with a piece of horse meat. Horse meat can easily be identified because it looks different from lamb or beef. Horse meat is by and large of dark brown color with some traces of white

Friday afternoon Tashkent was jolted with earthquake, though not with acute intensity as was the case in Pakistan where an earthquake of 6.5 jolted many parts of Pakistan. There is no time difference between Pakistan and Uzbekistan therefore earthquake tremors were felt in both countries at the same time.

Digging into the geography of the country, it comprises of over 15000 islands but Bali, hands down, stands tall and is usually the favoutite pick when a decision needs to be made.

Our itinerary included 3 days in Nusa-Dua which is about 30 to 40 minutes drive depending on the traffic from the Denpasar Airport, followed by 2 days in Ubud and last 3 days in Seminyak instead of Kuta which is more popular and happening town. The island makes you fall in love at the first sight and leaves an imprint of impermeable memories. Post trip. People say that Bali is now spoiled and for years the search has been on for a "new Bali". The tourism ministry in Jakarta has been working hercliously to open new tourism vistas and very soon will be announcing ten new Bali resorts.



Uncrowned surfs, mist-shrouded rainforests, paddy fields, coconut groves and fleets of colorful fishing boats fill up the Bali mosaic.

The island makes room for everyone, be it a nature lover, animal's conservation activists, a foodie, health freak or a business tycoon searching for a spot on the planet earth to unwind without his or her laptop and I phone, Bali offers unexpected surprises.

Nusa means island and Dua means two because there are two islands in the bay of Bali. The place is a bit secluded from the usual buzzing activities , beaches less crowded making it most suitable for honeymooners and a small family of vacationers to enjoy in serenity. Nusa Dua is a world within its own world. Water sports in the likes of Para-gliding or Parasailing, sea walking, surfing especades are all within throw away distance. Luxury Villas, tantalizing Spas, high-end shopping malls and chic restaurants offering a wide array of cuisines, pretty much covered the Seminyak up-scale canvas for us. As key court developments and political developments in the coming weeks unfold the question whether the Khan government can survive over the next few months is asked with interest in the diplomatic circles of Islamabad.

PTI government has moved a review petition in the Supreme Court on the November 28th verdict in the matter of extension in tenure of the Chief of Army Staff. The stand-off between higher judiciary and the military establishment went into a high gear last month when the Supreme Court asked the government to come up with a legislation to ensure that cabinet and the President have the power to grant an extension in service to the Chief of the Army Staff. The verdict made some detailed a legal reasoning and bound the government to answer some very critical question on the appointment of the COAS, its terms and conditions and how an extension will be granted. While opinion on whether any legislation that responds to the points raised in the verdict will be an Act of Parliament or it will require an amendment, in any case the government was bound to engage with the opposition. Khan government has tried to take the easy route and tried to handle the matter through a review petition. This could go either way for the government and the COAS.

The verdict in General Musharraf treason case opened another front when the former military dictator was handed down a death sentence by a special court. This is unprecedented and has attracted quite a strong response from the military.

Things were so serious that General Bajwa had to rush to PM Khan on his return from Geneva and meet him to express what the military states to be 'rage and disappointment' in the rank and file. Judge Wagar's' controversial' lines were surely directed at provoking a response and response it did invoke. The government has now the delicate task managing balancing act between the bench and military establishment. Sensing that any mishandling could lead to repeat of 2007 events where legal community and the establishment fought it out on the streets and in the courts

rooms. The government stepped back from its earlier stance of moving a judicial reference against Justice Wagar Seth.

Meanwhile one source close to PML (N) said that MNS has asked his party's leadership not speak much on either the extension or the Musharraf verdict as things are taking their own course and PML (N) does not need to intervene. He has told them though that no extension will be supported and also that things will not reach a stage where

extension legislation will be required. He has also reportedly said that the party should be ready for elections in the year 2020.

PPP has openly supported Musharraf verdict and is trying to gain some traction in Punjab by mobilizing its base which though weak still is showing some life. It put up a big show in Rawalpindi on November 27.

In the meanwhile, those who closely watch the developments in Islamabad claim that Chaudhry's of Gujrat (PML (Q) are again making maneuvers that are likely to result into an in house change in March next year. These sources ask to watch Chaudhry Pervaiz Illahi and are predicting that his resignation as speaker Punjab Assembly will set the ball rolling. How will different parties play out this phase will be interesting to watch.

Inside Khan government many cabinet members have been questioning Khan's strategy of just wanting to fix the opposition leadership and focusing too much on media instead of core governance issues. Shiekh Rashid who is the lone MNA of his own party and ally of Khan reportedly was very vocal in a recent cabinet meeting and criticized the economic strategy of the government. Some other cabinet members also voiced their concerns. Sheikh Rasheed even went to the extent of offering his resignation by saying that he did not want to continue.

The weak coalition constructed by PTI has many internal strains and any small coalition partner weaved away from the coalition can bring the government down.
























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# Azerbaijan keen to enhance educational links with Pakistan: envoy

# PM Khan pays half amount to use car gifted by Malaysian PM

ISLAMABAD, (DNA) - Prime Minister Imran Khan has acquired for his personal use after paying government of Pkaistan Rupees 3 million a car presented to him on behalf of the Malaysian Prime Minister Mahatir Muhammad.

A Proton X70 automobile was delivered by the Malaysian High Commissioner in Pakistan to Minister for Commerce Razzak Dawood for Prime Minister of Pakistan.

The standard procedure is for all gifts received by government functionaries to be deposited with Tosha khana, Once the gifts are deposited they can keep them for themselves after paying the half the value of the assessed value of the item.

The car that is Malaysian brand and soon to be available in Pakistan through local assembling was assessed at Rupees 6 million and PM Khan paid half the value of the car and purchased it according to the rules and regulations.

This is the first gift that Prime Minister has kept for himself. All other gifts he has received during foreign visits have been deposited with the Tosha Khana.=DNA

"And as the Malaysian High Commissioner, I was very pleased that Prime Minister Imran Khan visited Malaysia — from 19th until 21stDecember — to participate in the Kuala Lumpur Summit to be chaired by Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad — a most fitting way indeed to end a most productive and beautiful year, insofar as Malaysia-Pakistan relationship is concerned".

"While Malaysia is thinking of buying more from Pakistan, we also want to export more to Pakistan. In this regard, I need to promote one Malaysian product in Pakistan. So, I would like to give a Proton car to the Prime Minister of Pakistan who is a friend and very supportive of Malaysia. But, I have other reasons for this (that is) I hope that we can work together in producing that product"

In 1998 it was expanded form its original size of 1,684 hectares (4,161 acres)[6] or 16.84 km2 (6.50 sq mi) to 3,312 hectares (8,184 acres). Since then it has been managed by the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Wildlife Department. The purpose of establishing it was to conserve the temperate forests. Originally, the park stood at an area of 857 acres (3.47 km2), but in 1998 it was expanded to cover an area of 1,685 acres (6.82 km2).

The total population of Ayubia and surrounding villages as per a 1996 census is 18,097 people living in 2,311 households.

The climate of the park is cool in the summers, but harsh in the winters. While it remains only placidly hot in May and June, the cold sets in when the monsoons come to lash in late July and early August. In the winters cold increases in severity gradually until the west winds bring rains, which eventually turn into snow. The park remains snow-capped through the later part of winters.

It is protected area of 3,312 hectares (8,184 acres). The area supports temperate coniferous forest and temperate broadleaf and mixed forest ecoregion habitats, with an average



elevation of 8,000 feet (2,400 m) above the sea level.

Avubia National Park is surrounded by seven major villages and three small towns: Thandiani, Nathiagali and Khanspur.

The park has been developed as a resort complex from a combination of four mini resorts of Khaira Gali, Changla Gali, Khanspur and Ghora Dhaka in Galyat. It is managed by the Wildlife and Parks Department of Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

"I am given to understand that this year alone, many important activities have taken place including five ministerial level meetings. That includes the SAARC Education Ministers' Meeting in my country of the Maldives".

Ambassador Salim expressed these words on the occasion of SAARC Charter Day function held at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, on Monday.

Foreign Secretary Sohail Mahmood, was the chief guest while all ambassadors and high commissioners of SAARC countries attended the function.

He father said undoubtedly, despite many challenges, the importance of this organization, has in fact grown by every passing year. During the past 34 years, SAARC has made a difficult journey during which there has been economic growth social development and cultural advancement.

In spite of it, the overall development of SAARC and our region remain much below the levels of expectations and we have not been able to exploit the huge potential that remains unexploited. It is up to us alone to make the association more effective in order to keep it relevant to the present context.

He said he was hopeful that SAARC can still achieve its desired goals and objectives but only if all members hold same degree of commitment and display mutual respect towards each other and are determined to work together in a responsible atmosphere of friendship and cooperation.

As we mark another year since its establishment, we need to remind

and focus on how, as a region, we can improve the lives of our peoples through sustainable development.

In order to do that, what we need among ourselves now, more than anything else, is respect and confidence among ourselves and a serious effort to settle whatever differences we have among ourselves, for our own good and that of SAARC.

If political problems that have existed in the region for so long can be resolved amicably and peacefully, we could be the most prosperous in the world given the huge potential in the region, the ambassador added.

"While all these important activities are taking place in SAARC, we must hold our breath and wait to find out when the next Summit will take place. We all know that holding of SAARC Summit, which is the highest body of SAARC, provides renewed impetus to the SAARC process".

Last Summit was held in Nepal in November 2014, five years ago. Sadly, this has been the longest period SAARC has gone without a Summit.

The 19th Summit was to be held here in Islamabad in November 2016, but was unfortunately, postponed. It is hoped consensus among the Member States will be evolved soon to hold the Summit as early as possible.

Our resolve to regional cooperation remains undeterred in spite of some setbacks that we continue to face every now then.
